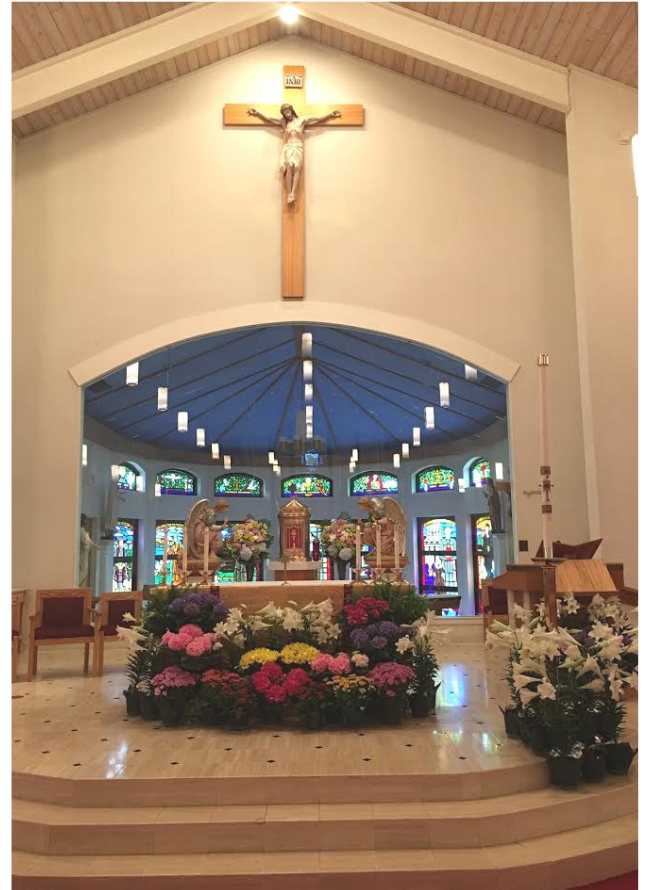

2017 Bishop Charles E. Herzig Humanitarian Award

The Diocese of Tyler is now accepting nominations for the 2017 Bishop Charles E. Herzig Humanitarian Award. The award is named in honor of Bishop Herzig who led the diocese from its creation in 1987 until his death in 1991.

The annual award was instituted in 2007 by Bishop Álvaro Corrada, SJ, third Bishop of Tyler, to recognize individuals who have made outstanding contributions within the Diocese of Tyler in seeking to promote human welfare. Those who receive the award demonstrate a great charitable love for the people of God and possess a life in the Church that has been marked by actions that have enabled individuals or families to receive basic human care.

This year, the award has been expanded to include Catholic institutions as eligible nominees, such as Catholic hospitals, Catholic schools, parishes, and organizations such as Catholic Charities and St. Vincent de Paul. The award will recognize institutions that exemplify the Gospel values of service, mercy, and charity in their communities in the name of Jesus Christ. Bishop Joseph E. Strickland will present the medal depicting Bishop Herzig during the Memorial Mass of Bishop Charles E. Herzig, Sunday, Sept. 10, at 10 a.m. in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception.

HOW TO BRING THE SWORD OF THE SPIRIT TO A GOSPEL GUNFIGHT

When a Protestant tries to shoot the gospel gun with Bible proof texts, here's what I do...

Have you ever been tempted to be a Catholic Wyatt Earp? You know, to be a Catholic gunslinger, a Quick Draw McGraw of the apologetics scene? Soon after I became a Catholic I would sometimes get myself involved with a Protestant in what I later termed a "Bible Gunfight". Like a couple of desperadoes my Protestant friend and I would take cover behind our respective church theologies and fire pot shots at each other, gun slinging Bible verses back and forth trying to prove our point.

The problem is, neither of us were very good shots. The Bible bullets kept whizzing over our heads. Here's why: no matter what verse the Protestant fired at me, I had a Catholic interpretation of that verse, and no matter what Bible verse I fired back, he had a Protestant interpretation of that verse.

Example: I'm trying to prove that baptism is necessary to salvation so I believe I've got the magic bullet. It's in the third chapter of John's gospel. Jesus is talking to the Pharisee Nicodemus and says, "A man must be born again by water and the Spirit." Now this is a real bullseye because my Evangelical Protestant friend is real big on John chapter three. This is where he gets his term "born again", by which he means the Billy Graham type of conversion experience. It's also where you find the all-time favorite Protestant Bible verse, John 3:16 — yes, the one they display at football games.

So, I stick my head around the corner, eye up the enemy and take aim. I'm sure I've got my man. It's clear that Jesus is talking about the need for faith and baptism, right? I take my shot. Bam.

He ducks and I miss. That's because he replies, "Water and the Spirit?" The "water" there refers to the water that breaks when a child is born naturally. The amniotic fluid. Jesus is saying that a man is born naturally — "of water" and then supernaturally born again of the Spirit. It's obvious! — What's your problem? Where do you get baptism out of this!?" Bingo.

As soon as you get involved in these Bible gunfights you realize that the exchange of Bible verse proof texts accomplishes very little. That's because the Protestant (despite his protests to the contrary) does not actually believe in his favorite doctrine of sola Scriptura (Scripture alone). He reads the Scriptures through his denominational doctrinal lens. He reads the Scripture backed up by his Bible commentaries, denominational assumptions, denominational education, context and background. Catholics do this too; we just admit it. We never claimed to believe in sola Scriptura in the first place. Catholics have always relied on the Apostolic authority of the Body of Christ — the Church to provide the interpretative authority to rightly read Scripture.

Therefore, when a Protestant engages me in debate and tries to shoot the gospel gun with Bible proof texts, I simply sidestep, put my gun in the holster and invite him to the saloon to have a drink. (He usually drinks sarsaparilla.) Once there me and my partner have a different discussion.

I resist all his attempts to draw his gun and fight it out, and instead I ask one question: "Before we swap Bible verses, I need you to explain why your interpretation of the Bible is the right one and the thousands of other Protestant interpretations are the wrong ones." I explain that Catholics are not Bible-only Christians, that we look to the Church to give us the reliable interpretation of the Bible, and that these interpretations are rooted in 2,000 years of study, prayer, obedience and faith from Christians in every age and across the globe.

10 enseñanzas del Padre Pío para "sacudir" tu vida

"Si el demonio no duerme para perdernos, Nuestra Señora no nos abandona ni siquiera un instante."

Herederero espiritual de san Francisco de Asís, el Padre Pío de Pietrelcina fue el primer sacerdote en recibir los estigmas de la crucifixión. Es conocido en todo el mundo como "fraile" estigmatizado. El Padre Pío, a quien Dios dio dones y carismas particulares, se empeñó con todas sus fuerzas en la salvación de las almas.

Los muchos testimonios sobre la gran santidad del fraile llegan hasta nuestros días, acompañados de sentimientos de gratitud. Sus intercesiones providenciales junto a Dios fueron para muchos hombres causa de curación del cuerpo y motivo de renovación del espíritu. Algunas enseñanzas del Padre Pío que "sacudirán" tu vida:

1. No te preocupes con el mañana. Haz el bien hoy.
2. Si Jesús nos hace así de felices en la Tierra, ¿cómo será en el Cielo?
3. Si el temor te deja angustiado, exclama como san Pedro: "Señor, ¡sálvame!". Él te extenderá la mano: apriétala con fuerza y camina alegremente".
4. Intenta hacerlo siempre mejor: hoy mejor que ayer, mañana mejor que hoy.
5. Si el demonio no duerme para perdernos, Nuestra Señora no nos abandona ni siquiera un instante.
6. Cuando pierdes el tiempo, desprecias el don de Dios, el regalo que Él, infinitamente bueno, abandona a tu amor y generosidad.
7. Sean como pequeñas abejas espirituales, que llevan a su colmena sólo miel y cera. Que, por medio de su conversación, su casa esté llena de docilidad, paz, concordia, humildad y piedad.
8. Haz siempre el bien, así dirán: "este es cristiano". Soporta tribulaciones, enfermedades, dolores por amor a Dios y por la conversión de los pobres pecadores.
9. Un convertido expresó temor de volver a caer. El Padre Pío le dijo: "Yo estaré contigo. ¿Piensas, hijo mío, que yo dejaría volver a caer una alma que levanté? Vete en paz y ten confianza".
10. Quien tiene tiempo no espera por el tiempo. No dejemos para mañana lo que podemos hacer hoy. Las sepulturas están rebosantes de buenas acciones dejadas para después...

Y, además de eso, ¿quién nos dice que viviremos hasta mañana?

Escuchemos la voz de nuestra conciencia, la voz del profeta:

"Si oyeras la voz del Señor hoy, no querrías cerrar tus oídos".

Debemos renacer y acumular solamente las riquezas que nos pertenecen, recordando que sólo el instante que escapa está en nuestro dominio. No podemos intercalar tiempo entre un instante y otro, pues no nos pertenece.
